The change in footfall for Weymouth BID over the last 52 weeks is 0.3% up on the previous year.

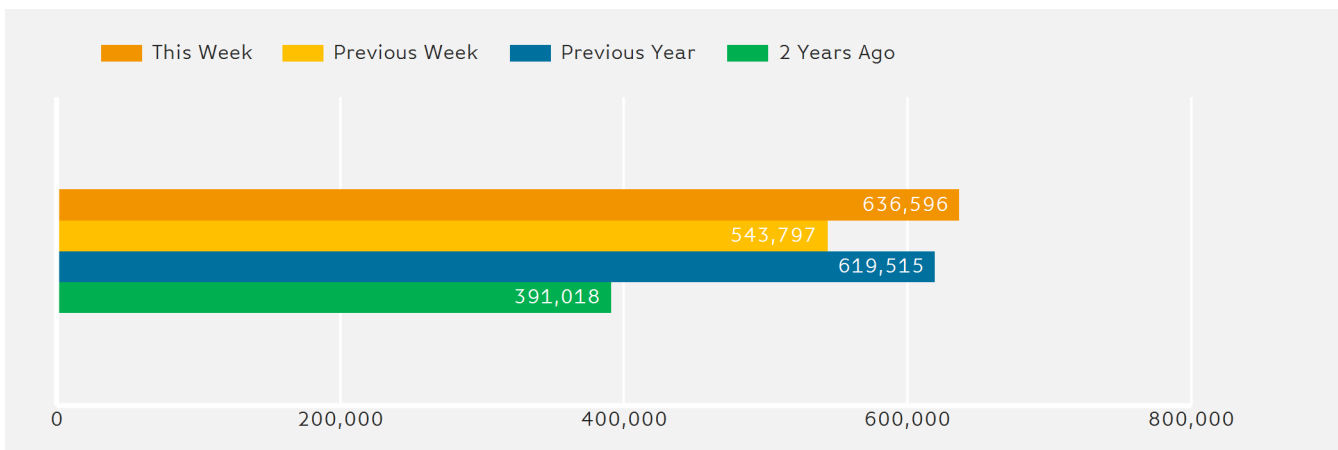
Footfall for the year to date is 6.2% down on the previous year.

The number of visitors counted for week commencing 3 April 2017 was 636,596.

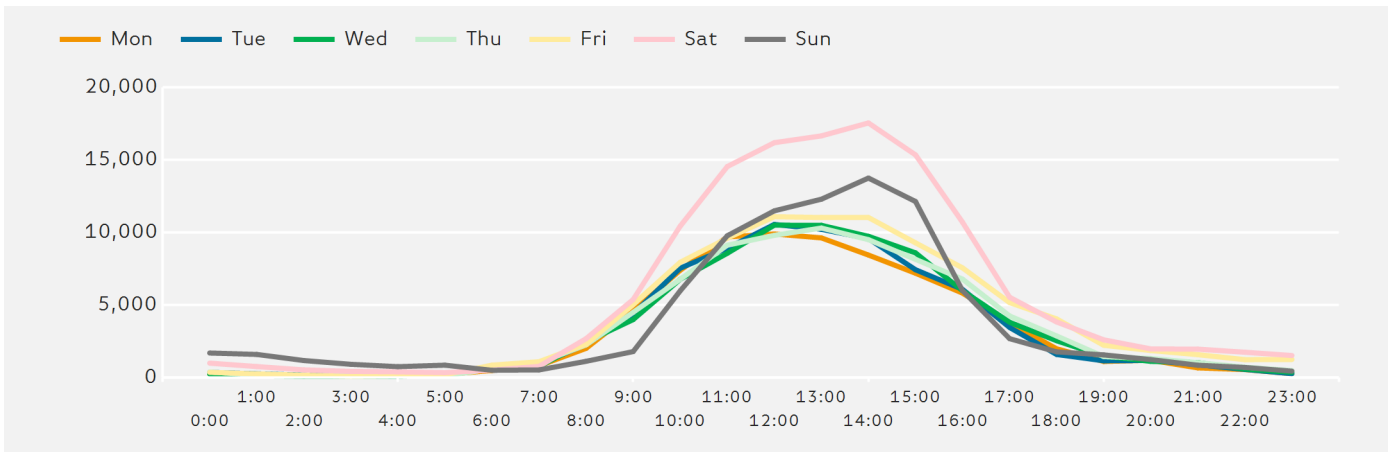
The busiest day in week commencing 3 April 2017 was Saturday with 133,153 visitors.

Footfall Totals by Week



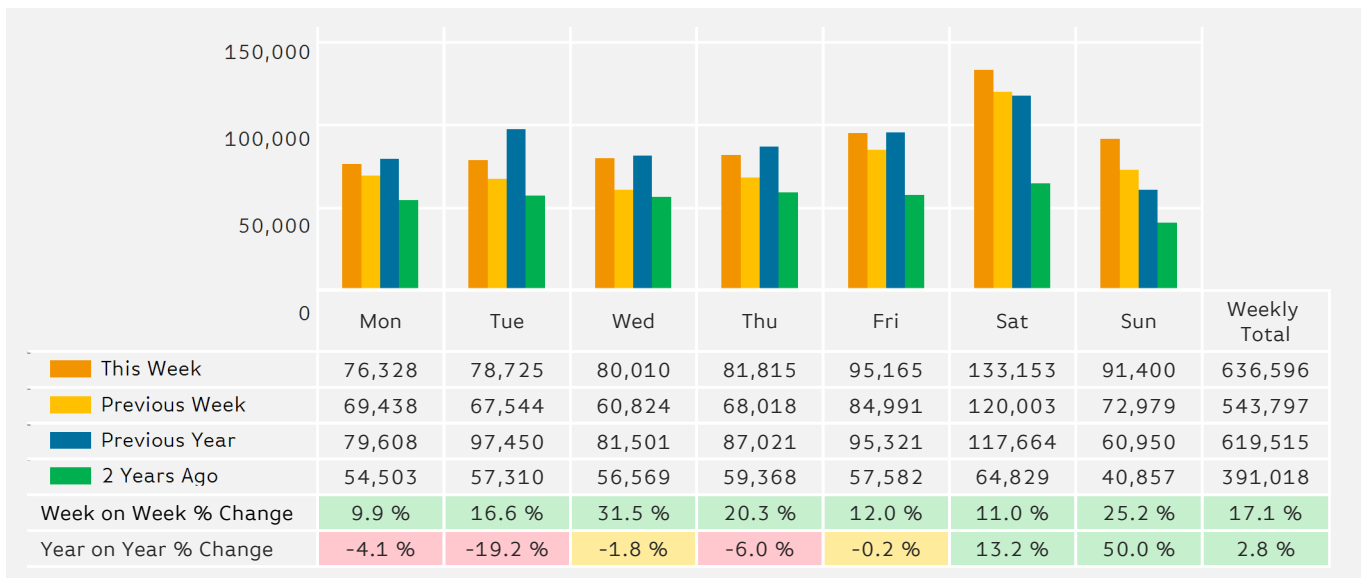
Footfall by Hour



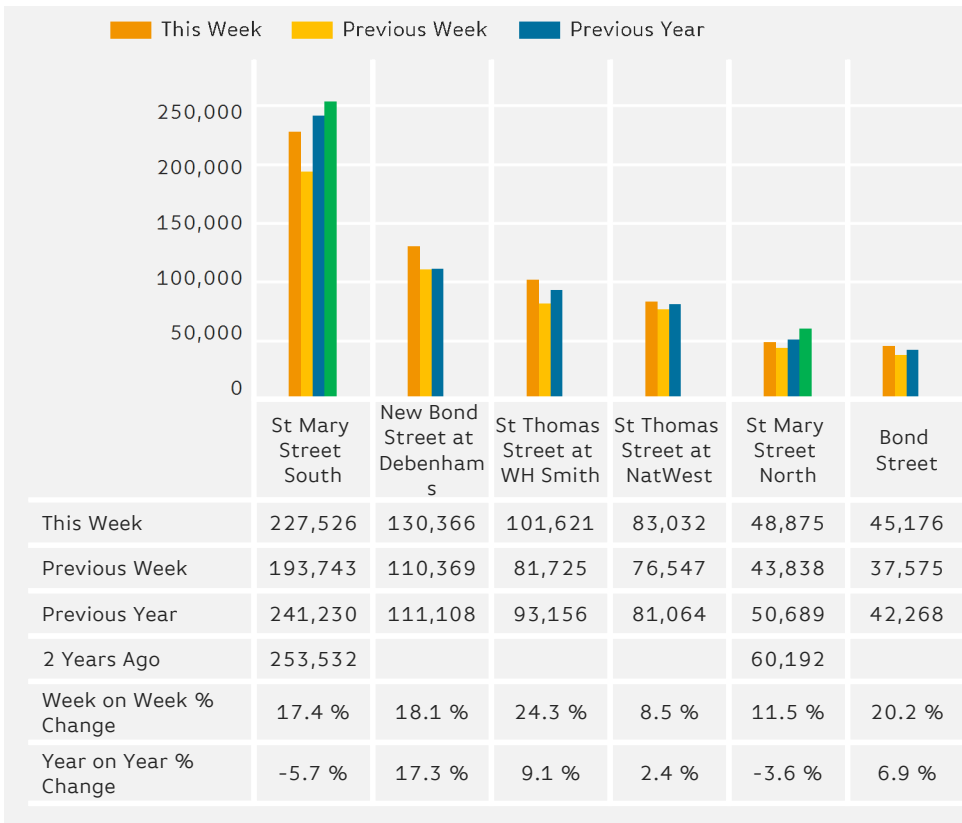

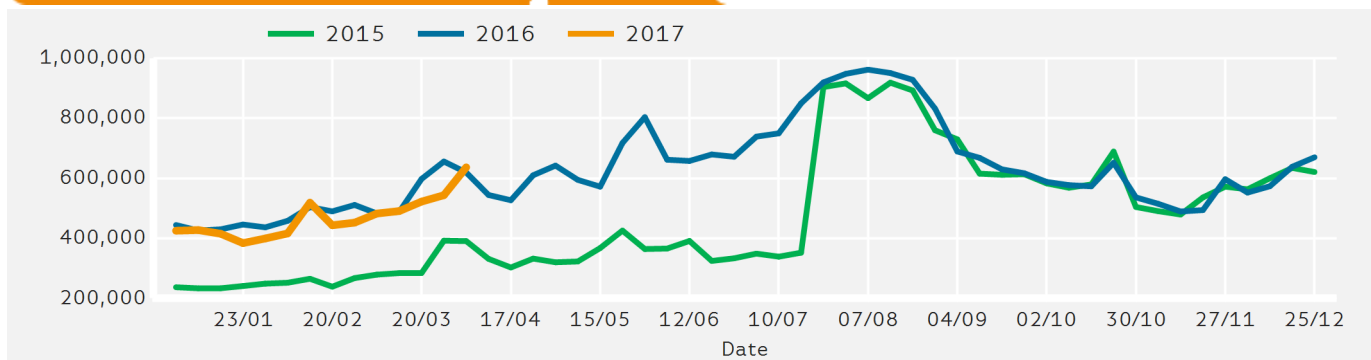
